

Corners at Wheat Ridge Shifts Gears

A long shuttered car dealership on 38th Avenue and Wadsworth Boulevard is moving closer to redevelopment. Plans for the 15-acre site by developer Wheat Ridge Corners, LLC focuses heavily on retail and features community spaces and the potential to add new market-rate apartments.

Known as the Corners at Wheat Ridge, the re-imagined project will have 80,000 square feet of retail space, including a 35,000-square-foot grocer, and 45,000-square feet for restaurants, bars, a coffee shop and other retail. The development will also include a public plaza at the corner of Wadsworth and 38th as well as a public gathering space or pocket park on the interior of the development. The southern portion of the project is



Helliemae's Handcrafted Caramels

Entrepreneur Ellen Daehnick has turned Wheat Ridge into a real sweet spot. In 2014, she decided the City of Wheat Ridge was the perfect place to move her growing candy business, Helliemae's Handcrafted Caramels. So she transformed a '60s-era automotive service station on 44th Avenue into a well-equipped production kitchen for her popular products. Last November, she expanded her food empire with the addition of Post Oak Hall, a retail shop featuring Helliemae's caramels as well as comfort food from Daehnick's hometown of Houston.
