<u>Transitioning Back to Paid Meals in School</u> <u>Year 2022-2023</u>

This Fall, 'Back to School' will also mean 'Back to Student Meal Rates' for nutritious school meals. TDA has created resources to assist with notifying parents about this shift.



Flexibilities in the Keep Kids Fed Act during School Year 2022-2023

The Keep Kids Fed Act passed on June 27, 2022, will allow higher reimbursements for meals, meal pattern flexibilities in the event of COVID-19-related supply chain issues, and other flexibilities still to be determined in School Year 2022-2023.

New School Year 2022-2023 Frequently Asked Questions Now Available

TDA has published the first version of the School Year 2022-2023 Frequently Asked Questions document that outlines transitional operational requirements and flexibilities in the new school year. The FAQ doc is located at here. Please check the FAQs frequently, as TDA expects additional guidance and flexibilities from USDA as the new school year approaches.

<u>Local Wellness Policy Flexibility for School Year 2022-2023 – Request Form is</u> <u>LIVE</u>

TDA was given the discretion to allow NSLP/SBP CEs to complete their first triennial Local Wellness Policy assessment by June 30, 2023. CEs planning to use the new deadline must inform TDA by July 15, 2022, via request form available on the Intake Forms page of SquareMeals.org.

Civil Rights Training Migrating to ICN

Effective May 15, 2022, the annual Civil Rights training that meets USDA Child Nutrition Program requirements as mandated in FNS Instruction 113-1 will be provided through the Institute of Child Nutrition (ICN) rather than TDA. New users must register with ICN, and ICN will issue completion certificates. Starting May 15, links to the online training and instructions for taking ICN classes can be found here.

30-Day Carryover Flexibilities for School Year 2022-2023 – Request Form is LIVE

Schools that operated the Seamless Summer Option in School Year 2021-2022 will be permitted to use a prior year's data for 30-day carryover, depending on how or if they processed household applications in SY 2021-2022 or SY 2020-2021. CEs planning to use this flexibility must notify TDA by October 15, 2022, via request form available on the Intake Forms page of SquareMeals.org.

<u>Paid Lunch Equity Flexibilities for School Year 2022-2023 – Request Form is LIVE</u>

USDA announced new PLE flexibilities for SY 2022-2023. Any NSLP CE with a positive or zero balance in its nonprofit school food service account as of December 31, 2021, is exempt from PLE pricing requirements for SY 2022-2023. Additionally, USDA is exempting CEs with a negative nonprofit food service account balance as of December 31, 2021, from raising meal prices in accordance with PLE requirements. CEs with a negative balance planning to use this flexibility must notify TDA via request form available on the Intake Forms page of SquareMeals.org.

Severe Need Reimbursements for School Year 2022-2023

As schools return to normal operations, CEs that operated SSO during SY 2020-2021 may not have the complete data needed to determine eligibility for severe need breakfast and lunch reimbursements in SY 2022-2023. These CEs may use the most beneficial claims data going back to SY 2019-2020 to qualify for severe need, as outlined in this article.

TX-UNPS FDP Upgrade Coming in 2023/2024

The ordering functions in the TX-UNPS FDP module for NSLP and SFSP will transition to USDA's Web-Based Supply Chain Management (WBSCM) system.
