This RCW requires districts to hold monthly drills, school safety policies, emergency mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery and more. Services also include training in Gang 101, Search and Seizure for administration, Mandatory Reporting (CPS 101), Social Media 101, and other areas of need for school staff, administrators, and community
