This month I'm issuing Farm Fresh Student Engagement Grants to 35 Texas school districts. The grant amounts range from \$5,000 to \$15,000 and will help pay for school gardens, field trips, and more. All awarded projects feature practical strategies for giving children hands-on experiences with Texas agriculture. Participating students will learn about real Texas food through activities that can forge a lifetime of healthy eating and appreciation for the hard work of farmers and ranchers. These grants will support my Farm Fresh Initiative and keep Texas leading the way in local food promotion and farm-to-school programs. I congratulate the grant recipients and encourage E-Harvest readers to continue introducing Texas children to all the beef, dairy, poultry, fruits, vegetables, and whole grains grown and raised right here in the Lone Star State.

Farm Fresh Sharing

This month's Farm Fresh Sharing features Lumberton ISD and Moore Honey Farm.

“Thanks to the support of the Local Food for Schools (LFS) Grant, Moore Honey Farm had the unique opportunity to bring the buzz of the hive directly into the classroom. We hosted an interactive educational demo at a local school (Lumberton ISD), showcasing a live observation hive that allowed students to safely experience the fascinating world of honey bees up close. Alongside the hive, we presented a short video about beekeeping and the critical role pollinators play in food production. The students were captivated—many had never seen bees so close before, and their questions reflected a genuine curiosity about agriculture, sustainability, and the environment.

To sweeten the experience, each student received a honey straw to sample real Texas honey, connecting the lesson to taste and memory. In the cafeteria, the school used our honey to prepare fresh honey butter, offering a tangible example of local food integration into daily meals. The LFS Grant made all of this possible. It helped us strengthen community ties, educate future generations about pollination and food sources, and showcase the importance of sourcing locally. The enthusiasm from both students and staff was overwhelming—and left us feeling inspired to continue these educational partnerships.”
