The Homelessness Research & Action Collaborative will launch a survey of students and employees this fall to help shed light on homelessness and food insecurity on campus.

"We know that students and employees are struggling to meet basic needs because we see it every day in our classes and on campus," said Research Director Greg Townley.

Students, staff and faculty will receive the anonymous survey in an email the first week of fall term. The study will be the first step to help students and employees overcome barriers to basic needs.

Study: More than 38,000 people homeless in 2017

More than 38,000 people experienced homelessness in Multnomah, Clackamas and Washington counties in 2017, <u>according to our regional study with PSU Northwest Economic Research</u> Center.

The report took a comprehensive look at homelessness and housing insecurity in the Portland tricounty area and the cost to provide housing and services. It was one of the first regional examinations of the homelessness population and cost. It sparked conversations and garnered news coverage across the Northwest, including <u>OPB</u>, <u>The Oregonian</u> and <u>The Seattle Times</u>.

2019 Legislative Round up with Dr. Zapata

There were multiple bills that collectively could really help with housing affordability and homelessness in the 2019 session.

These included a statewide rent control bill and essentially abolishing single-family zoning statewide for towns over 10,000. As a land-use planner, I'm particularly excited about HB 2001 passing given the legacy of racism and classism embedded in single family home zoning.

Being able to keep more people in their homes as in SB 608 is obviously a critical part of reducing homelessness as well. These are good first steps. We will need to continue to monitor and study the effects of these bills. Read the complete round-up of housing bills on our website.
