with their device, from software instillation to a cracked computer screen right before finals, they do not even need to leave campus for help.

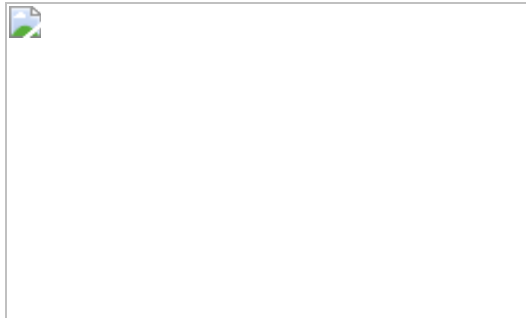
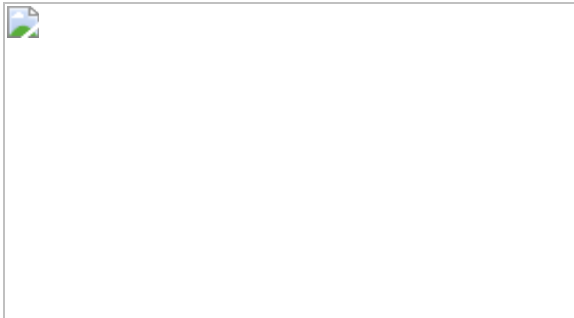
