#### **COURSE OFFERINGS**

#### **REL 700: AFRICAN AMERICANS AND RELIGIOUS FREEDOM**

Course Instructors: Corey D. B. Walker, Ph.D. and Sabrina E. Dent, D.Min.

This blended learning course designed for graduate seminary students will critically address the contentious politics of race and religious freedom in American public life. Particular attention will be given to how and in what ways power, violence, identity and pluralism form and frame the discourse of religious freedom across time and space. The course will feature a team of scholars and professional experts actively engaged in addressing these issues in multiple contexts.

The week-long intensive will give religious and civic leaders the opportunity to learn about the role of religion in public life while exploring three areas of competency: religious liberty, religious literacy and civil dialogue. Participants will be introduced to experts actively engaged in addressing these issues in their local and national contexts. This on-site experience will take place Jan. 2020 in Washington, D.C.

#### ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology of Virginia Union University and the Religious Freedom Center of the Freedom Forum Institute have partnered with the five other Historically Black Theological Institutions (HBTIs) for a three-year project examining African Americans and religious freedom. The African American struggle for freedom and justice cannot be fully understood without acknowledging the First Amendment freedoms at the heart of these struggles. This collaborative project will result in week-long intensive courses, seminars, symposia and other public programs.



















This year Giving Tuesday is December 3, 2019. Giving Tuesday is a global day of giving fueled by the power of social media and collaboration.





# Join Our Online Community!


