Three Professors Win Research Excellence Awards

PSU's <u>Office of Research & Strategic</u> <u>Partnerships</u> chooses recipients each year for its <u>Research Excellence Awards</u>. These awards serve to "acknowledge research faculty contributions to their field, originality of thought, and career productivity."

Robert Strongin (top photo), Professor of Organic Chemistry, has won the Senior Faculty Research Excellence Award. His research has focused on the effects of electronic cigarettes as well as on cancer diagnosis and treatment. Dara Shifrer (middle photo), Assistant Professor of Sociology, has won the Junior Faculty Research Excellence Award. She researches how sociology applies to teaching methods and students with neurological disabilities. And Melissa Lucash (bottom photo), Research Assistant Professor of Geography, has won the Research Faculty Research Excellence Award. She is the Co-Director of the Global Environmental Change Laboratory and her projects have studied climate change, forest ecology, biogeochemistry, and landscape modeling.






Biology Professor Leads Underwater Volcanic Expedition

PSU Researcher Helps Develop Forest Simulation App


Geography researcher <u>Melissa Lucash</u> is working to create an app that will show what forests will look like in the future, after the effects of climate change and other factors that will happen in the course of a forest's lifetime.

The project is funded by a five-year, \$1.7 million grant from the National Science Foundation's Dynamics of Coupled Natural and Human Systems program and is a collaborative effort between faculty and students from Penn State University, Portland State, North Carolina State University and the College of Menominee Nation.
