Navigate360 Implementation Timeline Update

By now we hope everyone is aware that Navigate 360 will be replacing Advisor Link as the advising platform for advisors and students. Currently the Scheller College of Business is **LIVE** in Navigate 360, testing out the system for the remainder of the spring semester as our pilot group (Thanks to all the Scheller advisors for making this a smooth transition so far!) Industrial Design Minor Onboarding Process

Students from across campus can complete an industrial design minor to strengthen their skills and understanding of creative problem solving as it relates to design. The ID minor provides an introduction to basic competency in sketching and visualization, an understanding of design methods and human factors, and a chance to apply this knowledge to a practical design studio problem.

Before submitting the Change of Minor form, students are required to read all the modules of the Industrial Design Minor canvas group. The reading can be done at their convenience, but on average, it takes about an hour to complete. Students can self-enroll in the Canvas course




