On March 13 | there will be a vote on a bill to ban the death penalty for people suffering from severe mental illness.

Bill HB1455 / SB1124 sponsored by Senator Richard Briggs (*R-Knoxville*) and Representative Bob Ramsey (*R-Maryville*)—excludes those with severe mental illness from death penalty. This bill would only impact future cases, not those who are already on death row.
