The strong La Niña pattern may be breaking up, but not before delivering a tough season- warmer temperatures, dry conditions, and one of the poorest snowpacks on record. As of April 1, statewide water availability sits at just 22% of normal, with impacts likely to linger through increased wildfire risk and potential water restrictions.

A shift toward El Niño is expected later this year, but for now, staying informed is key. Staying informed is more important than ever. Here are a few helpful resources.

- **InciWeb** - A centralized source for updates on wildfires and other incidents nationwide.
- **AirNow Fire and Smoke Map** - Tracks fine particle pollution (PM2.5), including wildfire smoke. The AirNow mobile app is especially useful when you're in the field.
- **CMC Wildfire Tips for Leaders** - Available on the CMC Trip Leader Resources page, this guide offers practical tools and links for assessing wildfire risk. While designed for trip leaders, it's valuable for all members.
