Historic Site to Host Oberlin's BFA Program

Oberlin has [joined a partnership](#) to redevelop the historic Park Synagogue near Cleveland into “**Park Arts**,” an ambitious reclamation project that will provide a first-class home for Oberlin’s



five-year BA/BFA combined degree program, which launches this fall. Located amid 28 tree-lined acres in Cleveland Heights, Park Arts places Oberlin within arm's reach of Cleveland's University Circle cultural arts hub—a key point of access for students in the BFA program.

Oberlin dominated in North Coast Athletic Conference action in April:

- Baseball's **Kyle Baxt** broke the single-season home run record against Hiram just days after notching his 100th-career hit. He sits 27th all time for career hits.
- Track and field boasts five All-Ohio Champions.
- Softball's **Sophie Stone** had another career month, tying her own single-game strikeout record with 12 K's against John Carroll.
- Men's lacrosse broke the top 25 for the first time in over a decade, according to the NCAA's inaugural NPI rankings.
- Women's lacrosse clinched its winningest season in seven years, and **Megan Hiller** earned NCAC honors after notching 100-career points.
