There are a couple of webinars available that you may be interested in attending on your own or we can open up the office to watch together. It is so important for those making decisions on our behalf and on behalf of our children and adults to hear from us about what life is like raising a child with a disability and caring for an adult with a disability. Our collective voices can influence lawmakers and others to make decisions that make the resources work for us and make sense for our family. We will have opportunities in the fall to share these stories with the DDA Ombudsman and the Washington State Developmental Disabilities Council, legislators, and city and county leaders. Although statistics can be important, personal stories leave a lasting impression.

It also features 5-inch wheels, a soft-textured handgrip, and a front-wheel swivel lock with a one-directional mechanism that prevents the wheeled walker from sliding backward. This walker is size X-small with a 24 inch width, 20 inch diameter, and a max user weight of 75lbs. The
