

Our collective voices can influence lawmakers and others to make decisions that make the resources work for us and make sense for our family. We will have opportunities in the fall to share these stories with the DDA Ombudsman and the Washington State Developmental Disabilities Council, legislators, and city and county leaders. Although statistics can be important, personal stories leave a lasting impression.



Nimbo Posterior Walker available to any family that needs it. This pediatric walker provides assistance and postural support for safe ambulation and is lightweight, height-adjustable, and foldable. It also features 5-inch wheels, a soft-textured handgrip, and a front-wheel swivel lock with a one-directional mechanism that prevents the wheeled walker from sliding backward. This walker is size X-small with a 24 inch width, 20 inch diameter, and a max user weight of 75lbs. The
