Message Regarding Clinical Research

In view of current concerns about the continued spread of COVID-19, and to ensure alignment with escalating measures at VUMC and around much of the country and to protect the safety of our research staff and investigators, specific action related to clinical research activities within the department is required.

Effective immediately, all new recruitment of participants into clinical trials conducted using PCRI and departmental resources is suspended until further notice. For patients already enrolled in existing clinical studies, any ongoing aspect of the research that involves person-to-person contact between the patient and personnel not directly involved with the clinical care of that patient is also suspended.

We will be continually re-evaluating risks and guidelines provided by VUMC and government officials to determine when to reinitiate clinical research in the department. Research using informatics platforms and other resources that do not require face-to-face interaction with subjects as well as analysis of data from completed clinical studies is not impacted.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation during this period of uncertainty.

Employee Recognition: GEMs (Going the Extra Mile)

We want to recognize good work when we see it and encourage our colleagues to recommend our next GEM. Do you know someone who has made your day brighter or easier? Someone who has gone above and beyond? Please let us know the details so that we can recognize that person for a job well done.

Christopher Canlas, MD, would like to recogonize Jane Brock, DO: *Dr. Brock has earned the GEM for prolonged excellence in her 12 years where she has dutifully served as Cool Springs Surgery Center Medical Director. Since 2008, she has seen the center prosper as evidenced by record-setting volumes every year. In 2009, CSSC won the prestigious Symbion's "ASC of the Year." From 2009-2013, CSSC was routinely in the top 10 percent of Symbion's ASCs thus winning the Symbion President's Award. Ownership switched to Surgery Partners which doesn't give annual rewards. If they did, CSSC would undoubtedly continue to garner accolades.*

Under her leadership, CSSC skillfully provided anesthesia to a range of sick patients, from the ASA 4 patient for outpatient colonoscopy to the ASA 1 pediatric patient for tonsillectomy. The efficient center expanded services to include spinal cord stimulator placement as well as the addition of a second GI procedural room. Despite increasingly sick patients in a fast-paced setting, patient safety was always maintained as evidenced by a very low hospital admission rate. Also, CSSC had four Joint Commission Surveys - two with zero citations, two with minimal citations. Her clinical success led to Vanderbilt obtaining the exclusive anesthesia contract for a private practice facility - Plastic Surgery Center of Brentwood in 2019.

Academically, she was an early participant in the SAMBA Clinical Outcomes Registry (SCOR) database. She manually collected data on thousands of patients. Her research led to several posters and publications showing how CSSC had one of the highest ASA 3/4 percentages in the country. She also showed that patients undergoing long cases greater than eight hours could still be discharged home safely from a free standing ASC. Her publications were recognized at the national level by presenting at the 2019 annual spring Society for Ambulatory Anesthesia Meeting.

We will certainly miss Dr. Brock's clinical excellence and leadership as she embarks on new endeavors.


