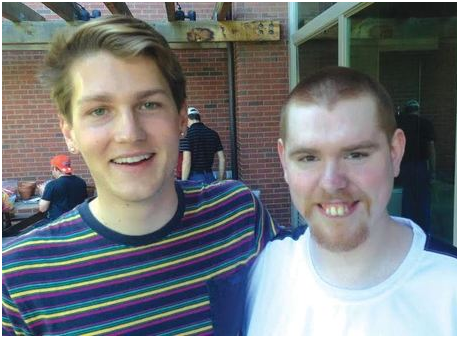

Who should/should not get the vaccine?
Does the vaccine have the COVID virus in it?
What are side effects of getting the vaccine?

Join us to get your questions answered so that you and your loved ones can make informed decisions.

Dr. Thanh Kirkpatrick, MD, MPH, is a former refugee from Vietnam, and has a passion for serving immigrant patients and for outreach to the DD community. She graduated from Pomona College in anthropology and received her Doctorate of Medicine from the University of Vermont and her Masters in Public Health in Health Administration from Loma Linda University. She completed her pediatrics residency at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She currently serves as director of the Vietnamese Family Autism Advisory Board helping families connect to therapeutic and support services across the care system and educating the community about autism and developmental delay. She was appointed to the WA State Developmental Disabilities Council in 2017 where she currently serves as a council member. Dr. Kirkpatrick is a pediatrician at HopeCentral Pediatrics and Behavioral Health, a clinic designated by the Washington Healthcare Authority as an Autism Center of Excellence to provide a range of services for families with children on the Autism Spectrum. She provides pediatric care for the linguistically and economically diverse community surrounding the clinic in south-east Seattle.



Dr. Peter Asante, MD, FAAP, grew up in Pawtucket, RI with his parents, originally from Ghana, and three brothers. He studied biological anthropology and Spanish at Harvard University and attended medical school at the University of Pittsburgh with an area of concentration in underserved populations, followed by residency at Seattle Children's. He currently practices at Yakima Pediatrics and is the chair of pediatrics at Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital in Yakima. "I have been fortunate to cultivate my passion for working with adolescents," says Dr. Asante. He continues to work in service of underserved populations, holistic care of medically complex patients, and improving management of youth with asthma.



Dr. Suman Pandey, MD, BS is a doctor located in Yakima, WA. Dr. Pandey graduated from the College of Medical Sciences in 2006 and has 15 years of experience. His specialties include Adolescent Medicine, Internal Medicine/Pediatrics, Pediatrics. Practicing as a pediatrician, Dr. Pandey specializes in treating kids of all ages, offering medical care for newborns, children & adolescents. He serves as primary care provider - the patient's first point of contact when seeking a diagnosis. Dr. Pandey is trained to offer well-rounded health care for children of all ages, collaborating closely with the patient's guardians to ensure healthy growth. Dr. Pandey is affiliated with Virginia Mason Memorial Hospital.
