

#### Undergraduate Student Advocates for Research Funding

UO environmental science student Rachel Cleveland recently traveled to Washington D.C. to attend 2018 Catalyzing Advocacy in Science and Engineering (CASE) workshop, which is hosted by the American Academy of Sciences. Cleveland's attendance was sponsored by the CASE program, which is funded largely by the Vice President for Research and Innovation with additional support from Government and Community Relations.

"It's important for the university to have money to give to students to do their research," Cleveland said. "One of the main talking points when I went to talk with my representatives was to give examples as to why their funding matters. It's more impactful when you can tell a story about why I've benefited and why other students will benefit from how they choose to fund science policy."

#### **Staffing Updates**


Jon Loftus has been promoted to the newly developed Post-Award Manager position. Jon will be responsible for the day-to-day transactional work and management of the post-award teams.
