When should we arrive to campus?

Due to the heavy volume of people on campus on game day, it is not feasible to drive through campus. We encourage you to park and be prepared to walk everywhere. Come as early as you can! The Family Weekend Tailgate will begin at 8:00 a.m. on the LSU Parade Ground.

If you selected **Mobile Delivery**, you should have received an email with the link to the football tickets. If you have not received it, please check your junk/spam folder. You may also contact the LSU Athletic Ticket Office at (225) 578-2184 or tickets@lsu.edu.

If you selected **Will Call**, your tickets will be available for pick-up at the LSU Athletic Ticket Office. The LSU Athletic Ticket Office is located in the Athletic Administration Building on the corner of North Stadium Drive and Nicholson Drive in the northwest corner of the parking Lot 101. The Ticket Office is open from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and it will also be open on Saturday, October 5 starting at 8:00 a.m. until halftime.

When do gates to Tiger Stadium open for the game? 9:00 a.m.

Which gate should we enter?

- If your tickets are in the Family Weekend sections 236-239, enter via Gate 8.
- If your tickets are located in the Family Weekend sections 637-640, enter through Gate 9 or 22-28.
- If your tickets are located in section 402, enter via Gate 22-28.

When is kick off for the football game? 11:00 a.m.

What items are allowed in Tiger Stadium?

- All seats in the Family Weekend sections in Tiger Stadium are bench seats, which
 means that they will not have a seat back. You are welcome to bring your own seat
 cushion (no larger than 16").
- Pack Sunscreen!

 registered families will be provided one clear bag that meets these requirements.
