Student Organization Registration- URGENT

Student organizations MUST FULLY COMPLETE the registration renewal process by 5pm on November 30, 2018 or they will no longer be considered a registered student organization.

Organizations that do not complete the registration/renewal process may face the following consequences:

- Lose their current/future space reservations
- Lose access to their locker in Stamp (if they have one)
- Lose ability to become SGA recognized and apply for funding

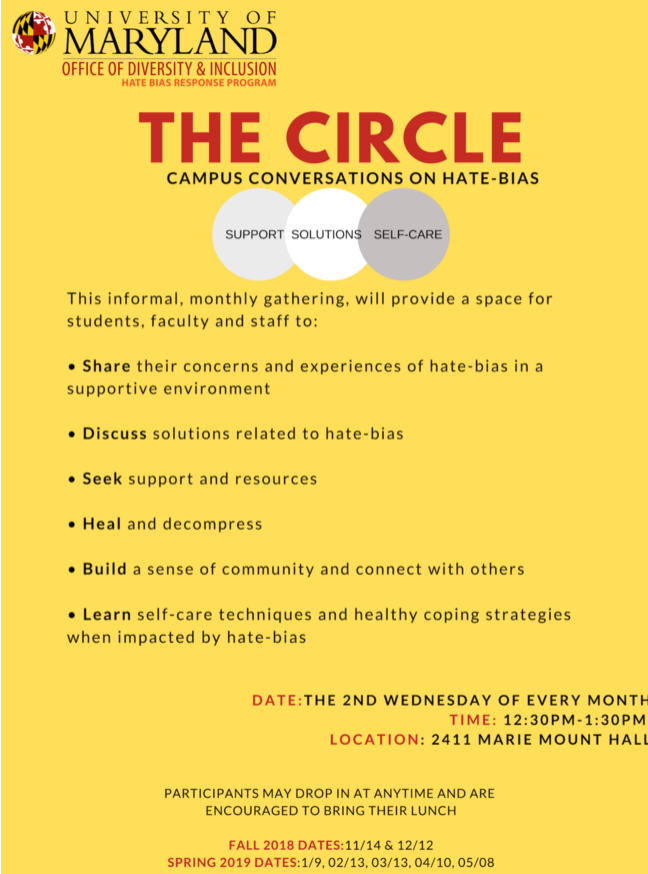
Bank Account Information for Student Groups

OrgSync Tip of the Week- File Storage

We always tell students that OrgSync is a combination of Facebook and Google Drive. When you log into OrgSync, you immediately see a "News Feed" from organizations that you follow. The Google Drive part ties in with the "Files" section in every organization's OrgSync portal.

In the files section of your portal, you can store folders, files, and pictures, organize them whatever way you want, and "share" with whatever members you want.

So, why OrgSync and not Google Drive? By uploading your organization's files on OrgSync, you will always have a backup plan in case a password gets lost or a past officer doesn't turn over files to new officers. SORC staff members have administrative access to your portal and will always be able to give file access to the appropriate members of your organization.

STUDENT GROUP HIGHLIGHT OF THE WEEK: **The National Association for the Advancement of Cored People (NAACP)**

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) of the University of Maryland College Park shares the same mission statement of NAACP with ensuring the political, social, educational, and economic equality of rights to all people and dismantle racial discrimination across this campus. From October 29th to November 2nd, NAACP hosted Student Activism Awareness Week (SAAW), a week dedicated to detail and celebrate student activism and its history at the University of Maryland. The State of Black Leadership is a panelist-styled event where we encourage dialogue within a panel of renowned community leaders and local public figures by targeting issues related directly to the Black community and engaging through Q&A. Their theme of Young and the Restless, angles not towards the

popular soap opera, but towards the exhausting oppression and strife young people face, especially people of color, towards microaggressions, systematic and institutional racism, police brutality, socioeconomic disparities, misogyny, homophobia, residential segregation, voter suppression, and other rationale of inequality and discrimination. The Annual State of Black Leadership will be on **November 12th, 2018 in the Nyumburu Multipurpose Room at the Nyumburu Cultural Center from 5:45pm to 8pm.**
