

They will offer three sessions on:


- Understanding Disability.

Sensory Tools: Patrons can check out a complimentary KultureCity Sensory Bag from the Box Office or table in the lobby area prior to shows at the theater. This bag includes sensory tools such as noise-canceling headphones, a communication cue card, VIP lanyard, and various fidget items.
