Participants engaged in a deep dive on the **cutting-edge of AI innovation**, covering the latest advancements in data science and future research directions. A second track addressed the **practical integration of AI** into the academic environment, exploring strategies for educators to effectively incorporate AI into teaching and learning while maintaining pedagogical rigor. Finally, the third major topic centered on **Digital Ethics**, emphasizing the necessity of responsible AI and Extended Reality (XR) application in the classroom, with discussions likely covering issues of algorithmic bias, data privacy, and ethical frameworks for responsible usage.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The Office of Faculty Affairs is currently working on the following awards and seeks nominees.

National Academy of Inventors Senior Member: At a minimum, candidates must demonstrate a high degree of innovation by holding 1 issued U.S. patent. Candidates must be in professional practice or research in his/her current field for at least 5 years.

American Association for the Advancement of Science, AAAS Fellows: Eligible nominees are AAAS members whose efforts on behalf of the advancement of science or

its applications are scientifically or socially distinguished and who have been a continuous AAAS member for at least four years leading up to the year of nomination.

IEEE Senior Member: A candidate shall be an engineer, scientist, educator, technical executive or originator in IEEE-designated fields. Candidates shall have been in professional practice for at least ten years and have shown significant performance over a period of at least five of those years.

American Society for Engineering Education Awards: Through the Awards Program, ASEE annually recognizes the outstanding accomplishments of engineering and engineering technology educators. By their commitment to their profession, desire to further the Society's mission, and participation in civic and community affairs, ASEE award winners exemplify the best in engineering and engineering technology education.
