

"Aspire" In Full Swing

Salpointe's "<u>Aspire: Arts Academics Athletics</u>" capital campaign is in full swing! The new Stearns Center for the Arts, expanded weight room, gym air conditioning, lighting for baseball, softball and track fields, six new classrooms and expanded STEM learning space have campus buzzing with excitement. The Aspire project will transform the Salpointe campus and the holistic education of our students. Classroom, STEM Center, weight room and

gym air conditioning projects will be completed this summer. Site preparation and construction of the Stearns Center for the Arts has begun and will be completed in May 2020. Lancer alumni, parents and friends have been incredibly generous and we now have gifts and pledges of over \$7.2M. With a total project cost of \$9.5M, there's still work to be done and we continue to talk to donors about this exciting opportunity to enhance the Salpointe student experience. Featured Event Class of 2019 Commencement and Graduation





Spirituality Through Softball

If you have been to daily Mass at Salpointe's Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Chapel in the past few weeks, then you have probably seen an increase of students gathering in prayer. This is, in part, due to two athletic teams attending Mass as a team: rugby and softball.

Head Softball Coach, **Amy Baray-Rocha '96** encourages her team to attend Mass together each week. They come together to refocus

whatever is on their hearts towards God. At Mass, Fr. Manu Franco-Gomez, O.Carm. will connect what they hear in the readings to their lives as athletes. In one homily, Fr. Manu expressed, "Softball is a vessel for God to work through."

"At the end of the day that's who you play for," agrees Coach Rocha. She incorporates faith and moral development into every practice and game. "The team chemistry has started to bloom since they started going to Mass together," she observed. "I can see them having a stronger connection with each other. They're playing for each other and not for themselves.
