

3 NIH Pilot and Feasibility Grants Awarded to SDRI for Clinical Research in Latino Health


Latinos, which comprise 46% of the population in Santa Barbara County, are disproportionately burdened by obesity and type 2 diabetes. SDRI has developed an aggressive research program to evaluate the therapeutic benefits, acceptability and potential for dissemination of a culturally-tailored, diet focused lifestyle therapy program (i.e. education and behavioral therapy to induce specific changes in dietary intake and physical activity), delivered by trained bilingual community health workers in socioeconomically disadvantaged Latinos living in the Santa Barbara area. Three Pilot and Feasibility grants were awarded by the the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to three SDRI adjunct Latina investigators who will conduct randomized, controlled clinical trials to assess: i) lifestyle therapy in Latino adults with obesity; ii) lifestyle therapy in Latino adults with type 2 diabetes; and iii) lifestyle therapy in pregnant Latina women with diabetes.

**SDRI Commemorated 100 Years
Since Dr. Sansum's First Dose of
Insulin Administered**



May 31, 1922, marked a monumental day in diabetes history, when Dr. William Sansum became the first U.S. physician to manufacture and administer insulin in the United States.
