


## Crash Course for Travelers to Japan



Akiko Ike: Boro Chiku-Chiku

The Wisconsin Museum of Quilts & Fiber Arts (WMQFA) presents Akiko Ike: Boro Chiku-Chiku, the artist's first-ever solo museum exhibition in the United States. Ike is a renowned textile artist, teacher, and gallery owner from Niigata, Japan. Using remnants of indigo-dyed cloth and old work clothes, she transforms found cloth by stitching with a strong thread in a manner she calls "chiku-chiku." "Chiku-chiku" is the onomatopoeic word Ike has coined to describe the sound her broad needle makes as it runs into and out of the cloth.

水無月 (Minazuki). June. Named after the season of pouring water into the rice fields. "水の月(Minotsuki)" literary means the month of water.

In Japan, June is also rainy season in most areas so Minazuki might be a perfect name for the month, despite its original reason.





Minazuki, the old name for June, means "water month." Tsuyu, or heavy rainfall season takes place during the months of June and July throughout most of Japan and lasts about 6 weeks. There are no official Japanese holidays in June.
