UT Climate Strike

This is the second Climate Strike that has occurred on UT's campus this semester. The purpose of a Climate Strike is to draw attention to climate change and demand action be taken to address this problem. The first Climate Strike was on September 20th and the second was on November 22nd. The strike in November was organized by the Knoxville Chapter of the <u>Sunrise Movement</u> and the on-campus organization <u>Students Promoting</u> <u>Environmental Action in Knoxville (SPEAK)</u>. Around 75 people attended the rally in the HSS Plaza. After hearing from a few students, the crowd then marched downtown to the

Knoxville City County Building. A letter about declaring a climate emergency in the city of Knoxville was written to the mayor, Madeline Rogero, before the strike. When the group arrived downtown, Erin Gill, <u>the City of Knoxville Sustainability Director</u>, read a response letter from Rogero. The mayor expressed gratitude for the action and urgency of the people who participated. The group then completed several environmental chants and the march was concluded. Sustainability Internship Program

The Internship Program through the Office of Sustainability has grown remarkably since its inaugural semester in Spring 2019. Currently, the program hosts 13 student interns, each working on sustainability related research projects created and implemented by the students themselves. The interns also attend monthly group meetings to collaborate on their projects, participate in workshops on professional development, learn more about sustainability, and discuss ways on how to expand the reach of their projects. Her project this semester was focused on the UT compost site where she took samples from the three types of compost and examined a lab analysis of the nutrient availability within the piles. She did this in order to determine which type is producing the best quality compost and how UT can potentially make it better in the future.



Hunger & Homelessness Awareness Week

The <u>Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week</u> is an annual program in which people join together across the United States to draw attention to the problems of hunger and

homelessness. This program was founded in 1975 at Villanova University. UT partcipated in this awareness initiative November 16th-24th. UT's chapter of the student organization <u>Swipe Out Hunger</u> coordinated the programs throughout the week. These programs were focused on rasing awareness about resources that are available on campus that work to diminish food insecurity for students. The Dean of Students Office also participated, offering a Hunger and Homelessness Summit that served to connect campus and community partners concerning the problems of hunger and homelessness on college campuses.
