# The Carson River Needs You at the Table

The Vision Project is an innovative, more flexible approach to addressing water quality impairments. We need you, and your friends and neighbors, to come learn with us about the process and how we can participate.

For more background, we invite you to read the <u>Problem Statement</u> and <u>Fact Sheet</u>. The Regional Board identified that over 75% of the West Fork Carson River has pollutants at levels that exceed the protective water quality standards. The West Fork Carson River was selected for this new Vision Plan process because of our collective dedication to our river—people care and are involved, restoration projects have been completed and more are planned, and there's a robust data set on water quality. Because of your past involvement, we have this exciting opportunity to be part of more water quality restoration and protection in the watershed.
