



Bengal Bound







3 Things Every UCFY Student Needs to Know


- 1. How to read a <u>degree audit</u>: The degree audit report is a valuable tool for academic planning, because it lists the courses the student has taken, the degree requirements he/she has fulfilled, and the requirements that remain to be completed.
- Senior college admission requirements: Each senior college has a list of requirements that must be met to move from UCFY into the college. Generally, there are minimum credit hours to be completed, a minimum GPA, and for some programs, certain courses must be completed. This information can be found in <u>Experience LSU (pages</u> <u>3-6).</u>
- 3. **CATS critical requirements:** These are the requirements that students must meet each semester to maintain academic progress in their chosen major. Failure to remain "on track" may dictate a required change of major. More information can be found <u>here</u>.
