Encounter Engineering (E2) Bridge Camp

What: E2 is a five-day program to give students a head start on their college career Who: Incoming freshmen with a declared major in engineering, construction management, or computer science

Where: LSU Campus (participants can move

into their campus housing early!) **When:** August 11-16, 2017

Why should your son/daughter attend?

- Every freshman will be placed in a team of 5 with an upperclass mentor.
- Team-building activities, math classes, and an engineering design project help to introduce participants to the skills needed to be successful.
- Participants will meet faculty, staff, and industry representatives and will be introduced to campus resources and degree/career information sessions.
- E2 participants are 10-15% more likely to be retained in an engineering degree

program and to graduate than non-participants!

Bursar Operations

Through myProxy, parents (or other third parties) can request access to a student's online Billing Statement as well as other records here. Parents will be prompted to create a communityLSU ID which will then allow them to request access from their student. Students are encouraged to select Direct Deposit as their preferred method to receive credit balance refunds at myLSU, Financial Services, Direct Deposit where they will enter a bank routing number and account number.
