Arts Over Tobacco is a tobacco prevention program funded by the Minority Initiative Sub-Recipient Grant Office (MISRGO) at the University of Arkansas Pine Bluff in effort to provide youth and young adults with alternatives to tobacco use and unhealthy behaviors. Brandon House is excited to be selected as a partner organization to host a group of students who will conduct their practicum project at Brandon House. As candidates for the Clinton School of Public Service, four students will be guided in skills-based and theory-based education to conduct graduate-level research. The students will focus on identifying the barriers that low-wealth creative professionals of color encounter to achieve economic equity and economic stability to sustain themselves and their families. Drs. Pamela and Patrice Bax will serve as the team supervisors to guide the students in their graduate-level research projects by engaging the students in fulfilling specified meeting objectives and ensuring the students are developing specific, measurable outcomes and deliverables.

Each of the students bring a wealth of creative arts, fundraising, and women empowerment experiences to the table. We are excited to work with these 4 Clinton students as we believe that with their help, the research will help Brandon House explore a neighborhood-based creative economy model that supports culture-based neighborhood revitalization for marginalized Arkansas creative professionals, artists and musicians.
