Effective Online Teaching Short Course

The *Effective Online Teaching Short Course* guides faculty in creating sound online courses in any discipline using Canvas tools and other resources to implement effective research-based practices for online learning. This CRTLE course complements and builds upon the CDE Canvas trainings and can be completed at any time before the accompanying live *Continuing Discussions for Effective Online Teaching sessions* that will take place in Microsoft Teams.

- 1. Introduction to Online Teaching and Learning
- 2. Fostering Interaction
- 3. Selecting Technologies and Content
- 4. Online Assessment
- 5. Principles of Backward Learning Design

UTA full-time faculty are invited to participate in the Effective Teaching Practices course, developed in partnership with the Association of College and University Educators (ACUE).


