Hotevilla Glassworks - To celebrate National Native American Heritage Month, the Peabody would like to highlight another native artist and educator - Ramson Lomatewama - from Hotevilla, Arizona. Ramson is the first and only Hopi glassblower as well as a traditional katsina doll carver, jeweler, published poet, and consultant. Ramson currently teaches glass art for the Hopitutuqayki (The Hopi School), an arts apprenticeship program located on the Hopi reservation. The Peabody was fortunate to host a talk with Ramson and Sarah Driscoll's English class earlier this fall and look forward to future engagements with Ramson and his art.



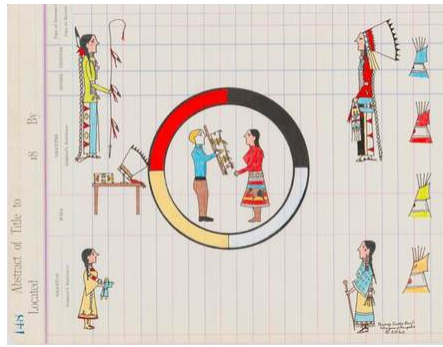

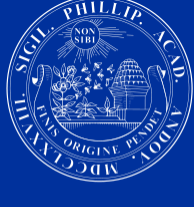
