#### **Alumni News and Highlights**

It is with sadness we share that **Marilyn Jean Schaser Lee '60**, known to the Cleveland Institute of Art community as Shaz, passed away April 21, 2018. After graduating from CIA, she taught art history at the college alongside Franny Taft. In the 1980s, she worked in the Admissions Department, touching countless students by giving guidance and confidence to those preparing their portfolios during the admissions process, and also providing friendship and counseling to current students.

Paintings by **Milan Kecman '69** are on view in *Head2Head* at the Stephanie Tubbs Jones Gallery at Cleveland Hopkins Airport now through July 13, 2018 as a part of its **Featured Artists Series**.

**Ken Foran '74** was commissioned to build a model of the abalone fishing boat, the Dirty Dozen, which is now part of the Morro Bay Maritime Museum's permanent collection. Accurate measurements were taken of the boat slated for demolition. The finished model represents the last abalone fishing boat that fished out of Morro Bay, California until 1976. His book *Model Building with Brass, second edition* came out in April 2018 with an additional chapter on using brass in model ship building. Ken continues to design and develop kit models for Model Expo, based in Miami, Florida.

**Thomas Lyon Mills '78** is now represented by the Ricco Maresca Gallery, NYC. He had a solo exhibition at the University of Arkansas in March and April and was a visiting artist there, where he gave a public lecture, held critiques with the university's graduate painters, and held a workshop with upper level architecture students.

**Steven Mastroianni '88** is hosting an exhibition at his studio featuring **John Gott '09** and Terry Durst. Join them for *Blowout: collaborative work by Terry Durst and John Gott*, on Saturday, May 19 from 6 to 10pm at Silver Scuro Gallery, 5606 Fleet Avenue, Cleveland.

**Bill Nottingham '01** designed the 17-inch bronze Rock and Roll Hall of Fame plaques located on the Walk of Fame sidewalk in front of Public Hall. The Rock Hall currently sells

mini commemorative coins for each induction class in the museum store.

Rit Premnath '03 has work in *Frieze New York* at Gallery Isabelle van den Eynde through May 6. He also has work in *Beyond Transnationalism: The Legacy of Post Independent Art from South Asia* at the Dr. Bhau Daji Lad Mumbai City Museum in Mumbai, India. The exhibition runs through June 19.

**Scott Goss '06** has an exhibition at **Harris Stanton Gallery** in Cleveland though May 26. *Transparent: A Glass Exhibition* also features the work of Timothy Stover and Marianne Hite. In this exhibition, Goss includes works that explore his memories of architecture and urban landscapes.

- The Cleveland Museum of Art is casting a role for their recently acquired performance art piece, called *Name Announcer*, by the internationally-acclaimed artist Pierre Huyghe. *Name Announcer* invokes royal court protocol, only to undercut its hierarchies as everyone who enters the space is named and their presence declared with equal prominence. The work challenges the conventions of detachment and anonymity within shared public space. This piece debuted on March 17 and will conclude on September 30. Two individuals currently share the announcer role, but CMA is seeking a third individual to assist with some remaining show dates. This role is a part-time and temporary opportunity (Saturdays and Sundays, 10am-5pm), and pays \$15 per hour. Interested applicants who are available for some, but not all of that time are encouraged to apply. In this role, the individual will stand at the entrance to the museum's contemporary galleries wearing formal attire. When a visitor enters, the individual will politely request the visitor's name, and then announce this name to

everyone within earshot. No previous performance experience is necessary. The requirements set forth by the artist are that the individual must speak English and must be able to stand for long periods of time.
