PARKING PERMITS AND TRANSPORTATION

Bringing a car to UW-Platteville and plan to park on campus? Purchase a parking permit at

Parking enforcement will start on the first day of classes, so make sure that you have your permit displayed in your vehicle, and you park in the correct parking lot.

Overnight parking in Commuter and/or Staff parking lots is always prohibited and will be enforced all year.

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATON and TEXT ALERTS

In the event of an emergency, UW-Platteville sends out notification through a number of different channels, including:

<u>PIONEER ALERTS</u>: UW-Platteville sends out emergency texts through the Pioneer Alerts messaging system. You are automatically enrolled if you have entered your cell phone number in PASS. <u>Please keep phone numbers up-to-date in the</u> <u>PASS system</u>. NIXLE ALERTS: The City of Platteville Police Department uses Nixle to send out alerts and advisories.

- <u>Safe Walk Program</u>: Students needing a Safe Walk escort can call 608.342.1584. Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

- <u>Emergency Call Boxes</u> located around the university that link directly to the police radio system.

- Access-controlled doors in the residence halls.
- Video surveillance cameras in various locations.

PLATTEVILLE SIRENS: Test, Fire, or Severe Weather?

Like many small communities, the City of Platteville is served by a volunteer fire department. The Platteville Fire department uses the siren system as a back-up system to notify firefighters of a call in the case their pagers fail. The fire call siren is a high-low, repeating wailing sound. In the event of a tornado or extreme weather condition, the city will sound the tornado or severe weather siren. This siren is a long, steady, unchanging tone.

The sirens are tested daily at noon. The city conducts a full siren system test the first Wednesday of every month around the noon hour. (Fair warning—in September this test will occur on the second day of the fall semester!)
