Based on close contact tracing, quarantine and exposure notifications will be issued by public health and shared with the school. We will continue to be adaptable as a school and respond to any next steps required of us to keep our students and staff safe.

Recently our school had the privilege of hosting a memorial to honor the life of John Rammuno, who was the longtime head football coach at EVHS. He did many outstanding things as a teacher and coach. It seems only fitting that we honor Coach Rammuno by leaving you with his lasting legacy in the form of his saying, "Ain't it Great to be a Devil".

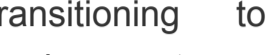

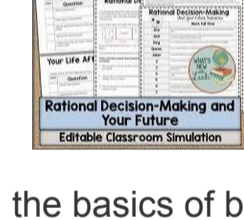
### More Yearbook Items!

- Please be ON TIME to school in the morning! We averaged 150 tardies each day the first week of school.
- Please leave earlier in case traffic is a problem!
- Park/drop off in the back parking lot to avoid traffic lines and standing in line at the front office.
- If you need to excuse your child's absence for the day, please call first thing in the morning so we can code the attendance appropriately.
- All students must check-in in the front office when late, and check-out in the front office when leaving.
- If you receive a School Messenger call in the evening, your child has been marked absent. Please call the school office asap to discuss this absence with the attendance office.
- Homeroom class is NOT optional! Please remind your child that they HAVE to attend homeroom class.



### 9th Grade Economics

In August and September, 9th grade Economic students are exploring practical personal financial literacy tools, including the basics of banking, the fundamentals of income and employment, and budgeting. Teachers Nicole Dewell & Holly Minor encourage families to discuss topics with their teens such as parents' first jobs, how parents selected their current bank(s) and if a family uses a budget. Sharing financial mistakes we've all made helps teens understand that people learn from mistakes and how learning lessons early can help them avoid those mistakes. We are delighted that our students are so enthusiastic about financial literacy.

### COVID Protocols

In the first few weeks of school we have already had multiple positive COVID19 cases in our school community. Eagle County Public Health is handling the contact tracing for the close contacts who need to quarantine. At this time our school protocol is to send home a "notification of exposure" to all students who are exposed in the same classroom, sport, or activity as the infected person. Within that notice exposed students will be recommended to do the following.

Wear a mask for 14 days and maintain distance when around others outside of your household, including extended family and friends, for 14 days.

Be alert for ANY sign of COVID-19 symptoms - including milder symptoms of COVID-19 such as a headache, congestion, a sore throat, fatigue, abdominal pain, nausea, diarrhea, vomiting, or a slight cough.

If symptoms develop, stay home, isolate your child from others right away, and get tested.

If your child is not fully vaccinated, they may be at higher risk from this exposure.

We recommend that you test your child 3-5 days after exposure.

It has already occurred where the same student has gotten this notice multiple times because of sharing common classes with different COVID19 cases. We apologize if you feel overwhelmed by the information, as we are sending out many notices at the same time.

These are the requirements we are working under at this time. We will continue to work with Public Health to determine any best next steps given the circumstances of our rate of infections in the building and other risk factors to try and limit the spread of COVID19. Thank you to everyone for your understanding as we work to keep our community safe.
