As the colder months approach, the Office of Sustainability encourages you to **Switch Your Thinking** with us! On a campus this size, our energy consumption is one of the largest ways we impact the environment. On average in November, UTK uses 16,482,221.3 kWh of electricity and 1,335,115.5 therms of gas. November energy consumption is equivalent to 18,745 metric tons of CO2 emissions.

It's the same amount of emissions that you would get if you drove an average passenger vehicle for 47,109,284 miles (you could drive to the moon and back almost 100 times!).

The UT Composting Facility has hit its benchmark for collecting over a million pounds of compostable waste this fiscal year (since this July)! This is a record, this time last year only 592,000 lbs had been collected!
