
The Nebraska Arts Council is elated to announce that you may now purchase Nebraska's very first Support the Arts licesense plate!

# **Creative Virtual Programming**

Wednesday, March 17, 2021 1:00 PM CST

Join us Wednesday, March 17th at 1:00 pm Central Time for our monthly Water Cooler Series. We'll hear from the American Midwest Ballet and the Minden Opera House about their creative virtual programming.

The American Midwest Ballet has been featured on NPR, showcasing their virtual production of The Nutcracker. They have offered a variety of programming during the pandemic, from the "Going Solo" series, which challenged company artists to create solo dance works that reflect their personal visions, to "DancerLife", which gives us an insider's look to a dancer's professional life.

The Minden Opera House in Minden, Nebraska was one of the first organizations to offer virtual programming when the pandemic shut venues down. They began with "The Empty Opera House" series, which included live virtual concerts, storytelling sessions and even art lessons. Currently they are working on a community art project with nationally award-winning artist Linda Stephen, which will include live, online instructional videos so the entire community can be involved. The artwork will incorporate both the artist's paper sculptures, and hundreds of small origami models made by Minden residents.

- How to Be Ready for -Shuttered Venue Operators Grants


The <u>Shuttered Venue Operators (SVO) Grant program</u> is not yet open, but Nebraskan venues can take action now to be ready. Demand for the program will be high, and preparation will be key to receiving funding. Americans for the Arts has put together a <u>list of things</u> venues can do before applications open. Suggestions include:

Make sure your organization has a <u>DUNS Number</u>.

- Use your DUNS number to register in the federal government's <u>System for Award Management (SAM)</u>.
- Gather documents that demonstrate your number of employees and monthly revenues.
- Determine your gross earned revenue losses.
- Determine the extent of gross earned revenue loss between 2019 and 2020 on a quarterly basis.
- Make PDFs of additional information such as floor plans, contract copies, and other items likely to be required.

- Sign up for a regional mailing list and webinar and develop a direct relationship.
- Send specific questions about SVO eligibility to <a href="mailto:SVOGrant@sba.gov">SVOGrant@sba.gov</a>.

The SVO program is the result of \$15 billion designated by Congress to boost live performing arts venues and other related entities whose revenues have been affected during the COVID-19 pandemic. <u>Download a FAQ sheet</u> about the grant.
