Most students at UT are aware of the seal superstition - "if you step on the UT seal



before you graduate, then you will not graduate within four years." However, most students are unaware of the specific type of surface surrounding the seal that is an effective component of stormwater management on campus. Effective stormwater management reduces the amount of runoff and runoff pollution by slowing stormwater and allowing it to soak into the ground and vegetation

underneath - this leads to improved ecosystem functions and water quality. The type of stormwater management pictured above is called permeable paving, which is the paving over of vehicle and pedestrian pathways to enable the infiltration of stormwater runoff. This kind of water-permeable pavement actually covers 38,000 square feet of campus. Additionally, underground cisterns are present underneath campus that can capture up to 79,000 gallons of rainwater for reuse after a rainstorm.
