Courses that incorporate community engagement into their work (in-person or virtual) may be formally designated as Community-Based Learning (CBL) courses through the University Curriculum Committee (UCC). Community-Based Learning adds value to your student's education and can instantly put them on the road to building their own important professional networks. Community partners may include nonprofit organizations, schools, faith-based organizations, businesses, and industry.
