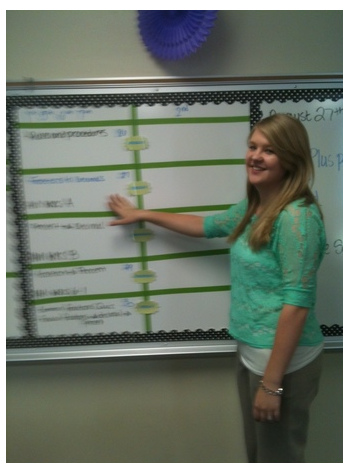
CRTLE Maverick Advantage Faculty Engagement (MAFE) Program
