What is the TennCare Shelter Enrollment Project?

Is your play room ready for flu season?

Influenza can be deadly for infants, young children, or those with a suppressed immune system. Many of your clients are especially vulnerable due to malnutrition, dehydration, poor hygience, exposure, chronic illness, substance abuse, and crowded living conditions. You can help prepare and protect those you serve!

> Encourage clients to wash their hands!! Hand washing is one of the primary ways to combat influenza. Ensure



bathrooms are clean and safe, and hot water and soap are accessible.

- Clean everything! Door knobs, toys, remote controls, landline phones, furniture sanitize as much as you can, as often as you can.
- Plan ahead! Are you and your team prepared for influenza and a possible outbreak at your program? How will staff respond? How will residents be treated? How can you contain an outbreak without responding punitively to those who are contagious? Determine a course of action now, before the crisis.

Get covered! If you are serving families who do not have TennCare, who have lost coverage, or who are unsure of their insurance status - we can help! Training for Communicable Disease Control in Shelter

Renewal Packets

TennCare recipients are required to renew coverage annually. Many families who receive EBT (food stamp) benefits were automatically renewed, but not all. Clients can lose coverage if they do not receive a renewal packet due to change of address, if they complete the packet incorrectly, or if they do not return the completed packet in a timely manner. TennCare offers assistance with the renewal process - and so do we!
