

While our campus was largely spared from the historic floods that affected Baton Rouge and the surrounding areas, we know that many of our students and their families, as well as faculty and staff, suffered devastating losses to the rising water.

Our university then did what we do best – we came together as a community to help our fellow Tigers in need. We've developed a relief fund to support students impacted by the flood and have been able to help many of those in need. For those who fared the flood well or live out of state and are interested in supporting a student through this time, donations are being accepted here. We're also offering temporary

housing and payment deferments to ease some of the strain and allow our students to focus on


Student Strategy Sessions




Welcome Back!




David Humphreys & Aaron Hogan Exhibit: Now- October 7th!






The Moscow Ballet's Great Russian Nutcracker!


