Women's History Month: Honoring Women in Science

Dr. Sandy Schmid is the first Chief Scientific Officer of the Chan-Zuckerberg Biohub. She came to the Biohub from the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center, where she held the Cecil H. Green Distinguished Chair in Cellular and Molecular Biology and served as chair of the Department of Cell Biology.

Born in Vancouver, Canada, she received her B.Sc. (Honours) in cell biology at the University of British Columbia and then moved to the U.S. for graduate studies at Stanford University. She was a Helen Hay Whitney postdoctoral fellow and Lucille P. Markey Scholar with Ira Mellman and Ari Helenius at Yale, then moved to The Scripps Research Institute as an assistant professor and served as Chair of the Department of Cell Biology.

A member of the National Academy of Sciences, she is a leader in the scientific community whose research, published in over 150 papers, is directed toward elucidating the molecular mechanisms and regulation of clathrin-mediated endocytosis (CME), characterizing the differential regulation of CME in normal and cancer cells, and analyzing the structure and function of the GTPase dynamin. She has received numerous awards, including the American Society for Cell Biology's Women in Cell Biology Junior and Senior Career Recognition Awards, an NIH MERIT Award, and the Arthur Kornberg and Paul Berg Lifetime Achievement Award in Biomedical Sciences.

THR Health Exchange Luncheon




