Wyoming is the largest source for uranium in the U.S. The weak prices have encouraged one large company to branch out to using an acid solution — a method shunned in the U.S. decades ago.

Rural School Gains National Attention On February 25, Morning Edition started off with a <u>quick report from Albany County</u>. Albany County School District #1 reopen an



isolated rural school to serve one kindergartener in the next school year. Cozy Hollow School is about an hour north of Laramie, and is the second school in the county that has a 1-to-1 student to teacher ratio.

The Dyrt is a Portland, OR based group that serves as a resource for authentic camping info across the US.
