

Consular Office Hours

The Consulate-General of Japan in Chicago currently offers the following operating times for Consular Services:

- Consular Service windows will be open from Monday Friday 10:00am to 12:15pm and 1:15 to 3:00pm.
- The Consular Section's phones will be available to call between 9:15 am and 12:15pm, and again from 1:15 to 5:00pm.

We do ask that all visitors cooperate with following necessary precautions:

- If you are feeling ill, please wait to come in until you are feeling completely well again.
- In accordance with CDC guidelines, a maximum of 10 people will be allowed in the waiting room. Be aware that you may need to wait outside the waiting room should more than 10 people be present.

Japan Information Center Hours

The Japan Information Center on the 10th floor's current operating hours are as follows:

Monday – Friday (except Consulate holidays) 9:30am to 12:00pm and 1:30pm to 5:00pm (library procedures will end 15 minutes before closing time)



THIS MONTH IN JAPAN



長月(Nagatsuki). September. Named after the season where the nights get longer. The original form was 夜長月 (Yonagatsuki), meaning "month of long nights". You may not feel it that much during September, but during fall season, the nights gradually get longer and Nagatsuki comes from the realization of the season change from fall to winter.







Nagatsuki or Yonagazuki means "long-night month," and was the lunar calendar name for the month of September. Respect for the Aged (敬老の日 - Keiro no Hi) Day and Autumnal Equinox Day (秋分の日 - Shuubun no Hi) are the two national holidays of September.
