2022 Tax Filing Information

Tax Day is coming up on Monday, April 18! International students, refer back to the email you received on February 4 from oip@valpo.edu titled "Important tax filing instructions for Current VU students and scholars". That email gives you important instructions on how to file your taxes (even if you didn't work at all in 2021). It will direct you to a special tax service called "Sprintax" which is designed to meet international student needs.

NOTE: in most cases, using other tax softwares such as TurboTax will not account for your status as F-1/J-1 international students! We strongly recommend that you do not use those tax services if you are in typical F-1/J-1 visa status.


