Funding Opportunities

Summer Support for International GEs

International GEs may apply for a second round of summer support for living expenses from the Graduate Student Assistance Fund through Sept. 15. International students who had a GE appointment during the 2021-22 academic year that was part of a multi-year funding offer commitment and do not have a GE appointment in the summer of 2022 may apply.

General Graduate Student Assistance Fund

Graduate students who experience financial hardship related to a qualifying event (welcoming a new child, experiencing a medical issue or paying for childcare expenses) are encouraged to apply for assistance. Learn more and apply here.

Howard Hughes Medical Institute Gilliam Fellowships for Advanced Study

The 2022 Gilliam Fellowships for Advanced Study is open to eligible pairs of thesis advisers and PhD students who are studying scientific problems in biomedical sciences, life sciences, or biological questions in related disciplines. The program seeks to increase diversity among scientists. Eligible students are those who (i) are in their second or third year of a PhD program, and/or (ii) have at least two full years of study remaining as of September 1, 2023. Students must also be U.S. citizens, U.S. permanent residents, undocumented childhood arrivals, or undocumented individuals who have been granted temporary permission to stay in the U.S. (DACA), and (iil) be from populations excluded from and underrepresented in science because of ethnicity, race, or disability status. This is a limited submission opportunity. To be considered for nomination, please submit a pre-proposal by September 15, 2022. Nomination deadline is September 29, 2022, with full applications due December 8, 2022.
