Excellence in Academic Advising

Oakland Advising has relaunched our participation in the Excellence in Academic Advising (EAA) initiative, which was paused briefly in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Developed by NACADA: The Global Community for Academic Advising and the Gardner Institute and funded in part by The Kresge Foundation. EAA is a three-year evidence-based self study of academic advising at OU. Over 125 faculty, staff, administrators and students are participating in nine committees focused on the "conditions of excellence" of advising:

Events

Major/Minor Expo

This year, the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business Administration, and School of Health Sciences collaborated and had one multi-school virtual fair in place of their individual, separate events. The purpose of the event is to help undecided or "re"-deciding students select their majors and/or minors. All of the majors and minors from CAS, SBA, and SHS were represented, as well as employers and alumni that assisted with the many different sessions. Students were able to join anytime between 11 a.m. - 1 p.m. Some students even joined multiple different sessions to learn about multiple majors and minors. Over 125 students RSVPd and over 60 students attended!

New Orientation Format

Due to the shutdown in late-March, the Orientation and New Student Programs and First Year Advising Center team had to quickly flip the New Student Orientation program to a 100% virtual format in just a few short weeks. Here are the highlights of our successful orientation of over 2400 new FTIACs:

- Creation of mandatory online orientation component utilizing e-space
- Creation of pre-advising online check-in process to verify major and incoming credit

- Implementation of text message reminders through collaboration with Undergraduate Admissions
- · Added orientation dates through July and August
- Led 345 virtual group advising sessions
- Oversaw 600+ hours of virtual drop in registration support staffed by advisers, office assistants and orientation assistants
- Hosted 97 workshops for students/parents on topics such as student financial services, well-being, university housing, campus resources, academic skills, student involvement, etc.
- Hosted 30 in-person campus kick-off events in August to welcome nearly 800 students to the physical campus
- Organized virtual new student welcome events with President Pescovitz and all academic areas where 1200 new students joined in live

FYAC One-Question Emoji Surveys

In order to keep a pulse on how our new students are doing during this unconventional semester, the FYAC has sent two quick, one-question surveys - emoji-style - to students. The September survey asked students' perceptions of the first few weeks of the semester and the October survey focused on student connectedness. Over 1000 responses were collected between the two surveys. Student leaders, advisers and office staff were able to respond to student concerns within a day or two of submission. These surveys have allowed us to better understand how we can support students better in the coming months. Additional surveys are being considered for winter 2021.

Pre-Professional Advising Website Updates

The Pre-Professional Advising Office has made <u>their website</u> more user friendly for students and staff. The redesign makes accessing resources much more easy for students and staff. Some highlights are: Getting Stated, Steps 1-5, Events, and Workshops! Pre-Professional Advising invites interested staff for signing up for their newsletter to stay up-to-date with their office!

SBA Women's Mentorship Program

The School of Business Administration's Women's Mentor Program is in its third year under the leadership of Tiffany LeDonne-Smith. This year the program has grown to 20 students and 20 professional mentors. This program kicked off in September where students were matched with their mentor. Pairs are encouraged to meet minimally once a month through April. It is the hope that in April everyone can gather in person for a networking luncheon to celebrate a successful year. Given the challenges of 2020, pairs are not required to meet in person but may do so virtually. We have many returning mentors to the program and both students and professional

mentors have indicated the program allows for students to ask questions about the world of business in a 1:1 setting. The guidance and mentorship has helped students grow both personally and professionally.

Chat with SECS!

The School of Engineering and Computer Science Advising office launched a new "quick question chat" for its students. This is a new method of contact between students and advisers. With the quick question chat, students are able to send a google chat message to the advising office and receive an immediate response from an academic adviser. As students and advisers are both learning and working remotely heavily since March 2020, this new initiative has provided students with quick answers to questions as they need them.

Stop-out to graduating!

The Bachelor of Integrated Studies advising office has been working hard on a stop out initiative. This fall they made contact with 175 students who have stopped out from the university. BIS has received a good response from students and have been able to get many students readmitted and reenrolled. They have even been able to get students graduated without stepping back into the classroom!
