Middle French Immersion Program - Application Deadline = today, January 28

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's systemwide Middle French Immersion Program (which begins in Grade 4), we offer an online process to apply. To apply for the Middle French Immersion Program (Grade 4 entry) for September 2022, applications for current grade 3 students must be completed online **between January 3 and January 28, 2022**.



An offer of placement in the program (a specific school) is guaranteed to all on-time applicants and will be made in the weeks following the close of the application window. Please note: Families with an older sibling currently enrolled in a French program and who will be in attendance next year are still required to complete an online application for the new student. Please select the "sibling option" within the online application.

Prior to the winter break, Trustee Trixie Doyle (Don Valley East) and I organized a Joint Ward Forum about the Covid-19 Vaccine for children aged 5-11. Supported by Michael Garron Hospital (MGH)/Toronto East Health Network (TEHN), it was geared to the Thorncliffe Park and Flemingdon Park communities. It was so well-received, I decided to organize a second forum, this time for the whole ward (see flyer above).

Pop-Up Vaccine Clinics in East Toronto



January 31 to February 6

First and second dose eligibility:

- Open to individuals aged 5+ who live and/or go to school in any "M" postal code. Children must be at least 5 years old at the time of vaccination.
- Children aged 5-11 can get their second dose 21 days after the first dose with informed consent from their parent/guardian.

Third (booster) dose eligibility:

- Open to individuals aged 18+ who live and/or go to school in any "M" postal code. Individuals must be at least 18 years old at the time of vaccination.
- Walk-ins welcome. No appointments needed.
- Pfizer or Moderna will be administered.
- Physicians and nurses are available to answer your questions.

Health card not required if you do not have one. You can bring an ID or document with your name, like a driver's license, passport, utility bill, pay stub, student ID or report card. Even if you do not have these documents, we encourage you to attend one of these clinics. Our team will do their best to help get you vaccinated.

Please dress appropriately for the weather as line-ups typically take place outside. Due to workforce capacity, there are a limited number of vaccinators at each of our clinics. We kindly ask for your patience as our team works as quickly as possible to vaccinate eligible individuals in a safe manner.

TDSB Winter Clothing Drive

One in every three children lives in poverty in our city, and too many children come to school without



proper clothing to keep them warm during the winter months. In addition, many TDSB students are new to Canada and this may be their first time experiencing a Canadian winter.

The TDSB holds an annual <u>Winter Clothing Drive</u> to help ensure that all students have warm winter clothing to get to and from school, and are prepared to participate in all of the fun outdoor activities winter has to offer. This year's Winter Clothing Drive will run from October 2021 to the end of February 2022. Donations help provide warm winter coats, pants, hats, gloves and boots for our students.

Our need for winter outerwear is greater this year. Canada is welcoming newcomer families from Afghanistan and the TDSB is welcoming many of these newly arrived students into our schools. The newcomer students are adjusting to their first Canadian winter and need proper winter outerwear.

Monetary donations can be made through <u>School Cash Online</u>. We will also accept <u>new</u> <u>winter outwear items</u>. Due to potential health & safety, hygiene, sorting and storage limitations, the TDSB can only accept <u>new clothing items</u>.
