FALL 2025 changes to Institute's Study Abroad Out-of-State/Out-of-County Tuition Waiver Policy

Effective Fall 2025

We'd like to share an important update regarding tuition waivers for GT students participating in study abroad programs:

☐ What's Changing?

Beginning **Fall 2025**, newly admitted students (matriculating **Fall 2025 and beyond**) will **no longer receive the Study Abroad Out-of-State/Out-of-County Tuition Waiver** for:

Faculty-led Study Abroad programs

Global at Home programs

These students will now pay **tuition based on their residency status** during the semester(s) they are abroad or enrolled in a Global at Home program.

☐ What About Current Students?

Students who matriculated **prior to Fall 2025** and are:

Currently enrolled in a GT degree-seeking program

Making academic progress

...will **continue** to receive the tuition waiver when enrolled in:

Courses designated in **Banner** as Faculty-led Study Abroad or Global at Home

Courses coded as **"Campus 7 (Studies Abroad)"**

GT Reports Decommissioned - Transitioning to Lite

Legacy Data Warehouse Decommissioning: GT Reports Impact

The **Enterprise Applications and Data Integrations (EA&DI)** team is continuing efforts to **decommission DWPROD**, Georgia Tech’s legacy data warehouse. As part of this transition, we are reviewing the use of **GT Reports** that rely on DWPROD to ensure a smooth migration to modern data systems.

What’s Happening?

In collaboration with the **Registrar’s Office**, we are:

- **Assessing GT Reports** that depend on DWPROD
- **Phasing out groups of reports** over the coming months

What to Expect:

- A **30-day notice** will be provided before any report is decommissioned
- Users will receive **clear instructions** on accessing **replacement reports in LITE**, when available
- Our goal is to ensure minimal disruption and provide seamless access to updated reporting tools.

Navigate360 Implementation Timeline Update

By now we hope everyone is aware that Navigate 360 will be replacing Advisor Link as the advising platform for advisors and students. Currently the Scheller College of Business is **LIVE** in Navigate 360, testing out the

system for the remainder of the spring semester as our pilot group (Thanks to all the Scheller advisors for making this a smooth transition so far!) Industrial Design Minor Onboarding Process

Students from across campus can complete an industrial design minor to strengthen their skills and understanding of creative problem solving as it relates to design. The ID minor provides an introduction to basic competency in sketching and visualization, an understanding of design methods and human factors, and a chance to apply this knowledge to a practical design studio problem.

Before submitting the Change of Minor form, students are required to read all the modules of the Industrial Design Minor canvas group. The reading can be done at their convenience, but on average, it takes about an hour to complete. Students can self-enroll in the Canvas course

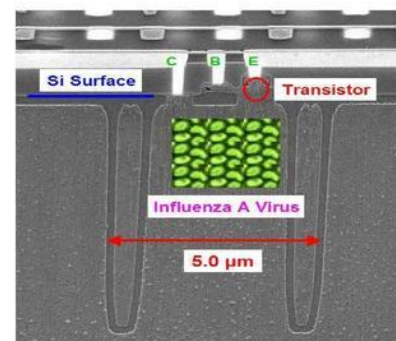
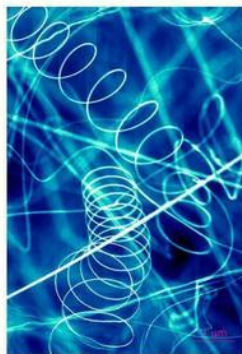
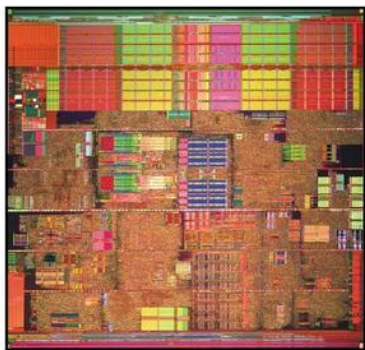
Psychology Summer, Fall, and Special Topics Offerings

CoE 3002 Tinto to Microelectronics and Nanotechnology Fall 2025

“Introduction to the Microelectronics and Nanotechnology Revolution”

Course Description

“We are in the swirling center of the most life-changing technological revolution the Earth has ever known. In only 70+ years, an eye-blink of human history, a single technological invention has launched the proverbial thousand ships, producing the most sweeping and pervasive set of changes ever to wash over humankind; changes that are reshaping the very core of human existence, on a global scale, at a relentlessly accelerating pace. And we are just at the very beginning ...”

Welcome to the microelectronics and nanotechnology revolution! This course will develop the general scientific and engineering underpinnings of microelectronics and nanotechnology and examine how this new technological revolution is influencing a broad array of interdisciplinary fields (engineering, biology, biomedical engineering, material science, chemistry, physics, medicine, technology, management) and civilization as a whole (art, business, film, entertainment, politics). Special “widget deconstruction” topics will address common pieces of modern technology (e.g., smartwatch, GPS, HDTV, digital camera, Blu-Ray, etc.) from the perspective of: “How do they do what they do?”; “How does microelectronics & nanotechnology play in that functionality?”; and “Where is the technology going and how will it change the way we live our lives?” Class discussion threads will examine the transformational impact of the microelectronics and nanotechnology revolution on modern society. A team “widget deconstruction” project will serve as a capstone for the course. No special knowledge of electrical and computer engineering is assumed.
