



Akiko Ike: Boro Chiku-Chiku

The Wisconsin Museum of Quilts & Fiber Arts (WMQFA) presents Akiko Ike: Boro Chiku-Chiku, the artist's first-ever solo museum exhibition in the United States. Ike is a renowned textile artist, teacher, and gallery owner from Niigata, Japan. Using remnants of indigo-dyed cloth and old work clothes, she transforms found cloth by stitching with a strong thread in a manner she calls "chiku-chiku." "Chiku-chiku" is the onomatopoeic word Ike has coined to describe the sound her broad needle makes as it runs into and out of the cloth.

The 30th Biennale International Sculpture Competition

UBE Biennale (International Sculpture Competition) is the Japan's first, large-scale outdoorsculpture exhibition launched in 1961 at the initiative of citizens in search for an improved post-war cityscape and richness of mind. Since its inception, the project played a significant role as the frontier of "urban revitalization through art." For the 30th exhibition, 15 full-scale works and 30 models of the winning works will be on display, followed by the permanent installation of winning works of Grand Prize and UBE Corporation Prize in public spaces across the city. Overseas applications are accepted.

JAS will award the Mondale Scholarship to undergraduate students enrolled in Minnesota colleges and North Dakota State University who want to broaden their knowledge of Japan through a combination of study and travel. Former Ambassador Mondale has continually promoted a deeper understanding of Japanese business, government, culture, and language among corporate leaders and employees in America. JASM is proud to have this opportunity to assist Minnesota/North Dakota students in their quest for a study experience in Japan since 1998.

Deadline: July 20, 2023



The Japan Foundation JAPAN FOLINDATION S Indo-Pacific Partnership (JFIPP) Network **Fellowship**

This program is designed to promote international research and collaborative activities on common policy issues that require cooperation and engagement within and beyond the Indo-Pacific region, with the purpose of contributing to the maintenance and strengthening of a free and open international order in the Indo-Pacific region, bringing about peace and prosperity to the entire region.

The program provides research and networking opportunities for next generation leaders of the region who either will or already engage with policy and policymaking. Throughout the program, main objective is building long-lasting relationships and new platforms for intellectual cooperation that will help resolve regional concerns.

Deadline: July 30, 2023

Education Grant

The Education Grant program supports projects from nonprofit organizations that will assist K-12 students, teachers, and the community deepen their understanding about Japan, promote cross-cultural exchange, and nurture global perspectives. Successful projects are awarded up to \$5,000.

Global Partnerships Small Grant

This grant aims to support to create and develop networks between Japan and the U.S. on grassroots level, and to support Japan-U.S. collaborative efforts to help resolve issues of common concern. Successful projects are awarded up to \$10,000.

JFNY Grant for Arts & Culture

This program provides support to non-profit organizations in the U.S. that organize projects that will further the understanding of Japanese arts and culture within the 37 states east of the Rocky Mountains, plus Washington D.C. Average funding with this grant is \$2,000 per proposal.

JFNY Grant for Japanese Studies

This grant aims to support projects that will enhance further understanding of Japan through academic exploration. Such projects generally take the form of conferences, colloquia, symposia, presentations, and lectures within the United States as well as in virtual format. Successful projects are awarded up to \$5,000.

<u>Grant for Nationwide/Statewide/Region-wide Events for Learners</u>

The JFLA provides financial support (up to \$1,000) for Japanese-language related events on the national/statewide/region-wide levels (speech contests, quiz contests, or presentational events, etc.) that are intended to motivate a large number of Japanese-language learners in multiple schools featuring different educational levels (primary, secondary, collegiate levels, and adults) and promote Japanese-language education in the area. Closed events for a single school are not eligible.

Examples: Speech Contest, Quiz Contest, Japan-themed Festival for Learners, etc.

Deadline: September 1, 2023

<u>Grant for Nationwide/Statewide/Region-wide Projects for Teachers</u>

The JFLA provides financial assistance for projects which promote Japanese language education in a wide area (nationwide/statewide/region-wide), not exceeding \$5,000. The project should benefit multiple Japanese language programs and as many teachers as possible.

Examples: Conferences/Seminars/Workshops for Teachers, Teaching Material Development, Research Projects, etc.

Deadline: 2 months before the project start date

<u>Grants for Individual Japanese Language</u> <u>Programs</u>

This program is intended to assist educational institutions in the U.S. to purchase teaching materials (textbooks, audio-visual materials, cultural decor, dictionaries, digital learning software, teachers' reference books, etc.) for their Japanese-language courses by providing financial support not exceeding \$1,000.

Deadline: September 15, 2023

Advocacy Support Letter

If your Japanese language program is in danger of being cut due to COVID-19, the JFLA will send a support letter to stakeholders (Superintendent, Principal, Dean, etc.).

THIS MONTH IN JAPAN



文月(Fumizuki). July. Named after the season where rice grows and matures. Its original form was 穂含月 (Hofumizuki), meaning "rice collecting month". Usually, in the current calendar, people collect rice during mid-August to early October so you probably won't see rice farmers collecting rice during this month. It is rather green and beautiful reflecting the bright sunshine.





July 7 is **Tanabata** or the Star Festival to celebrate the meeting of the deities named Orihime and Hikoboshi. The third Monday of the month is **Umi no Hi** (Marine Day), commemorating the return of Emperor Meiji to Yokohama port from a boat trip to Hokkaido in 1876.
